 Council business is continuing within Government restrictions and the Clerk continues to work from home. All Parish Council meetings are operating through remote technology. All Open Spaces are being maintained and litter picking is continuing. Play parks, although shut are being maintained (tennis court opened on 10th July 2020 and Play area opened on 24th July 2020) Planning applications are still be reviewed and comments sent in. The usual flower planters are being maintained. Both allotment sites remain open for tenants, subject to social distancing restrictions that were advised to them.
