As both the Chairman and Vice-Chairman were not available to attend the meeting it was **agreed** that Councillor Taylor chair the meeting.

19/43 Apologies

Received from Councillors Robertson and Brown and City Councillor Raven.

19/44 Declarations of Interest

Councillor Ketley declared a non-pecuniary interest in agenda item 19/56 as she is acquainted with persons to whom part of the agenda item relates.

19/45 Consideration and approval of Minutes 5 February 2019

The minutes of the meeting held on 5 February 2019 were formally **approved** by Councillors as a correct record and were signed by the Acting Chair.

19/46 Public Forum- to receive any representations from the public

Councillor Aldridge reported that the budget has been set by Essex County Council and includes an amount set aside for pavement defects and the Parish Council may report any specific concerns via him. He is awaiting a response from First Bus regarding bus issues previously raised. The library consultation continues although there will be a motion considered next week by the County Council in relation to keeping all libraries. He continues to press for the issue of a crossing over Essex Regiment Way to be considered. He will continue to press for the issue of the fly tip near the school to be resolved.

19/47.1 19/05227/CAT - 58 The Street, Little Waltham - Horse chestnut - Fell - Reason: Too close to the building and the roots are possibly causing structural damage – **No comments**
19/47.2 19/05506/CAT - 93 The Street, Little Waltham - 2no. Junipers - South side house - Fell - Reason: Trees are damaging patio – **No comments.**
19/47.3 19/00154/FUL - Greenways, Whitbread Farm Lane, Chatham Green, Little Waltham – proposed detached cart lodge and log store – **No comments**

19/47.4 19/00132/FUL - Blenheim Cottage, Back Lane, Little Waltham – proposed conservatory extension to rear – **No comments**

19/47.5 19/00131/FUL - Blenheim Cottage, Back Lane, Little Waltham – change of use from residential garage to physiotherapy clinic (D1) – It was noted that the application is supported by local medical professionals. **No comments**

19/47.6 18/02099/FUL - Outbuilding at Spartigans Hall, Leighs Road, Little Waltham - Conversion of existing outbuilding to new dwelling with all associated works. – **Agreed** to support comments from Essex Highways in relation to access to the property and parking provision. Also, as the proposals are to provide modest single storey living accommodation for low cost rent or entry level acquisition to submit that the building should be only for that purpose and no larger than the existing footprint of higher than the existing building.

19/47.7 19/00017/FUL - Site at Wheeler’s Hill, Little Waltham – demolition of existing kennels – construction of single storey dwelling – **Agreed** to support the comments of Essex Highways in relation to access to the property and requirements for a turning circle and public health requirement for a contamination report and ask for a requirement for 3 parking spaces.

19/47.8 19/00018/FUL = Site at Wheeler’s Hill, Little Waltham - Demolition of 3 storage buildings and the construction of 4 detached houses with all associated works – **Agreed** to support the comments of Essex Highways in relation to access to the property and requirement for a turning circle but to suggest parking provision should be made for 3 vehicles in view of size of proposed property.

19/47.9 19/00016/FUL - Site at Wheeler’s Hill, Little Waltham - Conversion of existing barn into a new dwelling, including a front porch extension, front and rear dormers and all associated works – **Agreed to object** on the basis that Essex Highways do not consider that the access to the property is unacceptable.

19/47.10 19/02574/NAMPRO - Land south of Broadfield, Main Road, Little Waltham – proposal to name new dwelling Orchard Cottage – **no comments**

19/47.11 19/05026/TPO - Boscombe, Cranham Road, Little Waltham - (All within area W1) T4 - Ash - Remove lowest branch - Reason: Give clearance to railings; T9 - Oak - Coppice to previous points Reason: Decay cavity in lower stem; T10A - Oak - Remove two low branches - Reason: Give clearance to railings; T11 – Oak - Cut ivy to base – **No comments**

19/47.12 19/05511/CAT - The Lilliepad, Brook Hill, Little Waltham - Lleyandii Cypress - Remove all lower branches to main stem to a height of 5m to give clearance to driveway; Conifer hedge and Loral hedge - Opposite side of drive - Trim by 5m - Reason: Trees blocking access to driveway and property – **No comments**

19/54 Clerk's Report

The Clerk reported as follows –

1. The large pothole in Church Hill has now been repaired.
2. On 9 February 2019 I attended a meeting in relation to potential development near Woodhouse Lane with Councillor Robertson.
3. Despite sending another email to Councillor Bentley regarding issues of the use of bus lanes and traffic conflict on Essex Regiment Way I have still not received a response.
A response was received yesterday and circulated to Councillors. Councillor Bentley stated that the use of the bus lanes by buses would be monitored.
4. I have contacted all members of the Speed Watch group who went out on 26 February for a session.
5. I contacted the local highways officer with the speed survey data and await a response.
6. In relation to a large fly tip on The Street near the school you will be aware that Essex County Council and Chelmsford City Council disagree as to which authority should clear it up. The matter has been referred to their respective legal departments and I continue to liaise with the County and City Councillors.
7. On 25 February I attended a Clerk's briefing at Chelmsford City Council in relation to the forthcoming election.
8. Each month I will keep you updated with matters that do not require action at this point in time by the Parish Council but need to be noted as ongoing. This month I can advise

It was noted that the Clerk has booked 2 spaces at the Transport meeting on 4 June 2019. Councillors requested the Clerk obtain an update regarding the repair of the bridges. The report was otherwise **noted**.

19/55 To receive an update regarding Cricket Club fencing and leasehold arrangements

The Clerk has been in communication with the officer at Chelmsford City Council in relation to the terms of the new lease and the extent of land to be leased. A substantive response is expected next week to enable the matter to move forward.

19/56 To consider matters relating to the Allotments

In relation to the allotments behind the recreation grounds a site visit was carried out which shows that the boundary on the ground does not measure the same as the boundary dimensions on the new lease plan so the issue has been referred to Chelmsford City Council to resolve.

In relation to Blasford Hill allotments the work to upgrade the water supply is imminent, the Scaffolding Company has agreed to repair the wall and there is just one full size plot vacant at present. The Clerk is awaiting feedback from the tenants as to which variety of apple trees are required for the orchard which may then be ordered from the Orchard Trust. In addition, the Calor Fund is now open for applications so the Clerk will submit an application with a view to repairing the fence.
